



Experience with Racism Survey Findings

ENVIRONICS DU NORD Creating welcoming communities requires the participation of all community members. As such, Northern Policy Institute and Environics Research asked the question, what are the current racism and discrimination realities in Northern Ontario communities that might impact welcoming efforts? Online and telephone surveys were conducted in February 2022 as part of a broader initiative to collect comparable, consistent data across the regions of Northern Ontario. The results of the Anti-Racism Survey showed a mixed picture. Based on the findings, there were several recommendations provided. 1. Continue public education about racism and discrimination in all spaces; 2. Identify who is not around the decision-making table and why; and, 3. Spotlight best practices and implement where possible.

To combat these issues, some developed countries have introduced legislation that regulates how these online platforms manage their users' information and content. Regulators in Austria, Germany and the United Kingdom have already taken bold measures to tackle the lack of social media regulation, while the Biden Administration is considering a similar slew of new regulations. Canada, however, lags behind. The country has considered, but not approved, legislation in this regard, leaving the management of misinformation and the

protection of its citizens' data up to companies' standards.
