



- Established in 1990s
- Data gateway
- Data from Statistic Canada and other data producers
- Analyse and report on socio-economic trends
- Focus on small area geography

The Community Data Program helps municipalities and community sector Organizations...


- 1. Monitor and report on trends






What is a "Community Data Consortium"?

- Legal group of organizations focused on the implementation of a public service goal
- Established at the community level
- Multi-stakeholder, multi-sector
- Comes together to acquire data
- Functions as a Community Development entity
- May Include provincial government departments


1. Fréquence des unités à faible revenu avant impôt, 2005

ants (2001-2006) in Selected Regions of Hamilton: Home Languages




