






Emission of Fine Particulate Matter (smog component) per facility highest in Greater Sudbury and Manitoulin



Average Annual Emission of Fine Particulate Matter Per Facility (Tonnes)



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Economic Dependency Ratio, 2010 to 2016*







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



Growth in Number of Children Facing Challenges Early Development Instrument


Early Development Instrument - Proportion of Children with Multiple Developmental Challenges



CUMULATIVE POPULATION GROWTH SINCE 1996 BY DISTRICT



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

CUMULATIVE POPULATION GROWTH SINCE 1996 BY DISTRICT







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





Integration in the Labour Market Lower participation rates compared to Ontario and Canada Participation Rate, 2001 to 2016




Integration in the Labour Market Youth Employment Rates higher than provincial and national average

The proportion of full-time jobs increased in Northern Ontario



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
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FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT AS A PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL EMPLOYMENT

Employment Rate of Francophones Compared to that of the Overall Population, 2016





Employment Rate of Immigrants Compared to that of the Overall Population, 2016





Employment Rate of the Indigenous Population Compared to that of the Overall Population, 2016



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



GDP Per Capital (2007 Chained Dollars), 2011 and 2016



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Employment Diversity by Industry Overall decrease in employment by industry diversification for NE and NW





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

Cumulative Growth of Non-Residential Building Permits Value (in 2017 dollars)



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

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

A Decreasing Number of Bankruptcies since 2006, but an increase from 2016 to 2017 for the NE




Number of Business Bankruptcies

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

The Median Income Increased Since 2006 in Every District



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
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MEDIAN INCOME (IN 2016 DOLLARS) BY DISTRICT


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Median After-Tax Income of Francophones, 2016

Income Immigrant Population




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Median After-Tax Income of Immigrants, 2016
