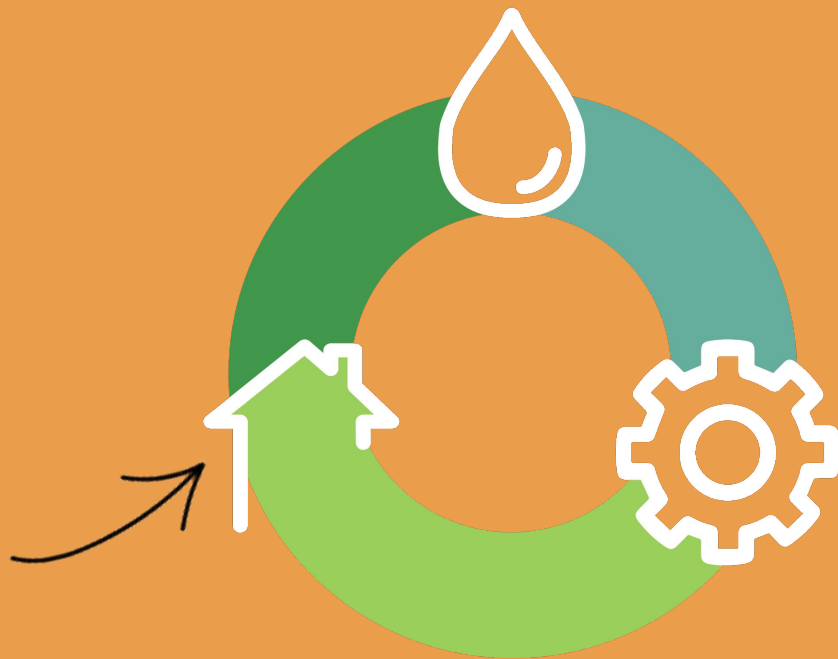

The Problem;

Current initiatives are not proactive in an integrated & engaging approach to solve the housing crisis with First Nations Communities.

ECONOMIC LEAKAGE & EMPOWERMENT

The existing practices for **funding** and fulfilling the supply chain does not permit **autonomy**, stop **economic leakage**, or empower communities to **build internal capacity**.

Lost opportunity to leverage existing programs and nurture geopolitical will.
