

Identity, income, housing, education, employment, mobility, age and population statistics – at the District, community and even neighborhood level!*



As a consortium lead with the Canadian Council of Social Development's Community Data Program, NPI Is now able to make important social and economic data available to communities and organizations throughout Northern Ontario.

The NODC and allows municipalities, indigenous organizations, and community groups to purchase data at significant savings by sharing the costs with each other.

Data sets include Census/ National Household Survey target group profiles, Census/ National Household Survey custom cross tabulations, Canadian Business Patterns, Taxfiler Data, Environics Envision, and Citizen and Immigration Canada permanent residence statistics.
